
Space Station for a reasonable fee. The museum will supply the model, and are looking to for it to be completed by the end of March, 2015.

terrain there, combined with the fierce fighting they encountered, challenged these men in unimaginable ways. The courage they showed, and their loyalty to each other was surpassed only by the love they had for one another. As I read, I felt as if I had grown to know these men, which only made learning about the demise of so many of them that much harder. I highly recommend this book!

A Sub From My Past Surfaces Again

The old Renwal George Washington kit was one of my first builds, more due to my father's efforts than mine. I still have that model, it's in my den. It's been dropped a few times, it's dusty, and a few parts are missing but it's one of the most precious things I own. It brings back memories that are warm and happy.




So imagine my surprise when I visited my LHS and found that Revell had reissued this kit. Wow, look at all the stuff in this kit, a totally bogus atomic reactor, the large and roomy crew quarters with a sailor swabbing the deck no less! Damn, the George Washington has more space in it than the old Sea View from "Voyage to the Bottom of the Sea".

Just look at all those torpedoes and Polaris missile launch tubes! The model even has a working propeller, periscopes, rudder and diving planes. Man, if the Russians get a hold of this model they'll know how our subs are built! Renwal must have a spy in the Electric Boat Division.

The reissue kit has one major problem however. Regardless of what the original box

art states, this reissue will NOT, repeat NOT actually fire a Polaris missile. The spring loaded Polaris launch tube of the original kit



is missing, probably due to product liability laws. Heaven forbid that little Johnny gets a Polaris missile in his eye!

All is not lost however, a Polaris missile is in the kit, but not illustrated in the instructions. With a little bit of work and a ball point pen spring I think I can make my George Washington shoot a Polaris.

This is an old kit, circa 1960 but the molds have held up well with little flash noted. The decal sheet for the interior is totally outrageous and totally bogus, more appropriate in the old Sea View!

I'm going to build this model and brush paint the interior exactly like the box art, again totally wrong but totally fun.

If you're a modeler of a certain age buy this model, it'll bring back a lot of memories as it did for me.








One final observation, can anybody please tell me where the ballast tanks are? Can't seem to find them in the model.


