I Bought a Schaufelradbagger!

Did you ever buy a model and then wonder why you did it? Here's a prime example of such an event. In the fall of 2013 Squadron was selling a lot of models at extremely good



prices and in a fit of madness I purchased the Revell of Germany Bucket Wheel Excavator, aka Schaufelradbagger, kit #08813 for \$69.95 along with a few other beauties. What can I say it was a really big box of plastic and it was cheap. I think this kit was first issued in the early 1980's but I'm not sure.



According to the instruction sheet, more on that later, there's 229 parts in the kit along

with 8 feet of rubber strip for the conveyer belts and two different sizes of thread for the extensive rigging. These parts are contained in 6 plastic bags, one of the bags being nothing but the safety railings for the extensive stairs and walkways in the model. These railings have to be cut to length using charts contained in the instruction sheet. There are even vinyl treads for this monster.




Now about those instruction sheets. They are huge, 24 pages with 38 steps, and would shame the Sunday edition of the New York Times! There are extensive rigging diagrams for the conveyer belts as well as the support and lifting cables.

The size of this kit is amazing. I've placed a one foot ruler in some of the pictures to give you an idea of the size of this thing. When built the Schaufelradbagger (don't you just love that name!) will be about 40 inches long and 17 inches high.








This looks like a fascinating build, it's like nothing I've ever built before. Looks like the
