





#### Welcome back to Mike Terre with a new "TERRE"-A-Gram!

Eduard 1/72nd scale Fokker Dr1 in Richthofen's markings

After the past few builds I decided I wanted something simple, something that would go together in a week or so. Looking through the stash I found a bagged Eduard 1/72nd Fokker Dr1 that I had bought years ago from Squadron during one of their legendary sales for \$2.00. Imagine an Eduard kit for two bucks!



There was really nothing difficult about this build, it was an Eduard kit after all. The parts had great detail and absolutely no flash. The cockpit had good detail and only seat belts and a throttle quadrant had to be added and these came from the spares box. A neat cockpit detail was the compass mounted on the lower right portion of the sidewall. The decal sheet even had a compass face! Sidewall structure was also nicely molded. The cockpit interior was painted Tamiya XF-59 Desert Yellow (actually a mid-tan) and the metal structure picked out with Tamiya XF-66 Light Gray as was the control stick and rudder pedals. The wooden seat was first painted Tamiya XF-15 Flesh, then streaked with Tamiya XF-9 Hull Red followed by a coat of Tamiya X-26 Clear Orange. This technique gives a very good representation of varnished wood and was used on the propeller as well. The fuselage was then joined with virtually no filling or sanding needed.


Before final assembly I decided to paint all the major parts and this was done using Tamiya XF-7 Red followed by a Krylon gloss coat. Once dry the superb decals were added without any problems at all, didn't even need a setting solution. An addition coat of Krylon Satin followed and final assembly began.



Eduard really engineered this kit as it was almost impossible to screw up the wing alignment. All the wings were one piece, with the bottom and middle wing joining notches in the fuselage. The interplane struts were also one piece and ran through slots in the middle wing. With the struts in you merely had to drop the top wing into place and once secured the cabane struts were added. The fits were perfect as was the alignment. It took about fifteen minutes to get the wings all aligned. GREAT ENGINEERING EDUARD!

Next was the engine and landing gear. The engine was a little gem and a quick coat of Tamiya XF-69 Scale Black followed by a dry brushing using Tamiya XF-84 Dark Iron which brought out the detail and with that the engine was done and installed along with the cowling. The landing gear and associated struts fit perfectly. The tires were picked out using Tamiya XF-53 Neutral Gray.











Believe it or not the DR1 had little rigging, just some around the landing gear and foward cabane struts. There were also small runs of flight control cables that were easily done. Rigging only took about an hour, with stretched sprue being used as the rigging material.

A little weathering using black and gray pastels and the model was complete!

It was nice to do a simple build and I'm happy with the results. The Eduard kit just fell together. I find it's hard to make monochrome (one color) stand out put there's nothing like a black Iron Cross on a red wing to make a model "pop".

Thanks for reading, doubt I'll be up for the summer meetings as I really don't want to deal with the GSP and the "down the shore" traffic on a Friday afternoon. However, I'll continue to write about my builds. Currently building the 1/72nd Classic Plane vacuform kit of the Blackburn Triplane. If you want to see an interesting aircraft just "Goggle" Blackburn Triplane, a rigging project if there ever was one. Take care guys, see you in the fall!

## Professor John Bucholz gives us an overview of an oft over-looked need for modelers-quality tools!

Tool Time Product Review-

Zona Hobby tool kit #38-700

If you are new to scale modeling or just starting to do a bit of scratch building, the Zona kit #38-700 might be a good fit for your modeling needs. Bundled together in one neat package are five necessary items for modelers.

First is the mini miter box set-a nice bright orange miter box and a hefty wood handled razor saw. The box has the usual 60/45/and 90-degree slots precut which will cover most cuts. If you need a custom cut other than the ones provided, the box is plastic so you can cut any angle needed into the surface of the box. The saw is hefty but the blade is very thin to provide very exact cuts in your materiel.

Next is the pin vice-all metal and very substantial in the hand with two reversable collets. This allows you to use drill bits from 0 to 1/8 inch in diameter. You can also hold any object with a round shank (think scribing needles).

Next, we have the curved point tweezers-at 4 and 1/2 inches they are perfect for picking up those small parts on your bench. The jaws are serrated for a better grip

on any object. The jaws are very nicely machined and can even pick up a stray drill bit with ease.



Now we come to the retractable hobby knife with extra blades-the main point being the blade is fully retractable. It is also flat sided so it can't just roll off the bench. You get five extra blades with this knife and when the blade is fully out the exposed portion is only about 1/2 the length for more controlled cuts.

Last but not least is the three by four-inch stainless steel L-square- marked in 1/32nd increments on both the inside and outside edges. On the flip side you have metric markings (76mm by 101 mm). This tool is great for ensuring perfectly square corner cuts.

The suggested list price for this kit is \$32.24 (quoted from the 2020 price list). You can check out the full line of hundreds of tools at www.Zonatool.net. Zona tools are also available at many Hobby Shops that cater to model railroaders.
