The judging process was both fun and arduous. A newcomer to judging was part of my team and he seemed interested in attending a future club meeting. Several entrants did approach me after my group had finished to ask what we look for. I suggested that a photo build log can greatly help show the amount of work put into a subject and it can also illustrate the complexity of whatever was built. I am noticing a trend, especially within the past 5-10 years. When I first became a member, the show was heavily dominated by the traditional military subjects and civilian vehicles. Now, it appears that the Misc. & Sci-Fi categories are the way of the hobby in the future. The Gundam categories continue to amaze me. This was the first year of them being their own entity and the entries did not disappoint. I would highly suggest that anyone who has not built one of these models do so. I think moving forward, we'll need more people that know the intricacies of their building process and that should help better aide in the judging process.

I asked for feed-back on the show from members and a few came in. First from new member Bill Joel, who was also a vendor.

Bill - as a participant, both as a vendor (on the SME tables) and a member; I found the show to be very well done. I was able to sell off a number of my kits and there was good traffic for most of the day.

While I still have a number of kits to liquidate from my stash, I was able to add a few of the ones I was looking for and a few that I wasn't. Overall, better reduction than increase in stash. :-)

Recommendations/observations:

Vendors should be asked to put their names on the Vendor badges in addition simply Vendor. It's much easier to speak with people on the hobby when you know

the person's name. **This goes for the meetings as well.** (my emphasis, Ed.) I'm still trying to learn people's names, but if they were to have a name badge (similar to the one's used for vendors) it would be helpful.

Temperature - while one can't control the weather, the use of AC in the vendor area would have been helpful, at least where I was. Several people mentioned that they were falling asleep due to the higher than expected heat.

Crowd control @ the food window and seating.

The crowded waiting lines extended into the area where vendors had their tables. While this might be good for some, it crowds out those who are not waiting for food. I realize that the venue staff was working at the cafe and not the club.

Seating was limited near the food window and there were no tables available. In addition, there were limited waste disposal containers, which led to some debris making its way to the floor.

Overall the show was another success and I enjoyed myself. Looking forward to the next and hearing what others thought.
